Inspection team visits 7th MDG Monday

Inspectors from the Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Health Care Organization and the Air Force Inspection Agency visit Dyess Monday to evaluate the 7th Medical Group.

The inspectors' visit is part of a tri-annual survey that assesses all areas of 7th MDG operations and clinic health care.

"This is the medical group's version of an operational readiness inspection," said Col. (Dr.) Schuyler Geller, 7th MDG commander. "Our operational readiness will be evaluated along with the quality of health care delivered to the more than 16,000 Dyess beneficiaries."

The JCAHO is a civilian accreditation agency that inspects civilian and military facilities based on accepted standards for agencies providing health care, said Vance Smith, 7th MDG quality services director.

The Health Services Inspection division of the AFIA is responsible for inspections at all Air Force medical facilities to assure continuing compliance with Air Force directives.

"The AFIA team also looks at how well the 7th MDG is supporting the wing with health care and force health protection to assure a fit force is ready when called upon to deploy," Mr. Smith said.

"Since we're no longer a hospital but a large clinic, we're not required to have the JHACO inspection, but we always strive to go above and beyond," Colonel Geller said.

The JCAHO team will complete its evaluation April 22, while the AFIA team finishes April 23.

7th Medical Group wins president's award

The 7th Medical Group was selected as the Air Force winner of the 2004 Commander-in-Chief's Special Recognition Award for Installation Excellence by the Department of Defense.

"Due to the best efforts of the men and women in our group, we were able to enhance our services despite facing many obstacles," said Col. (Dr.) Schuy-

ler Geller, 7th MDG commander. "We continue to be the number one military medical choice to support the White House and the president."

The award was established in 1984 to recognize the outstanding efforts of the people who operate and maintain Department of Defense installations and who have done the best with their resources to support the mission. The award encourages commanders to create an environment that

promotes innovative and creative ways of enhancing base-level services, facilities, and quality-of-life.

Only two medical treatment facilities in the Air Force have won this award. The 7th MDG is the first group to win this award in Air Combat Command.

"This is a very stiff competition," said Colonel Geller.

The 7th MDG was the first facility to combine

39th AS deploys to support OIF, OEF

With only a handful of people left behind, the 39th Airlift Squadron packed up and shipped out April 9, heading east to support Operations Iraqi

and Enduring Freedom. "The 39th is deploying as the lead unit of one of the largest deployed C-130 squadrons ever assembled," said Maj. Greg Elkins, 39th AS operations officer. "The deployed squadron will be flying missions providing intra-

theater airlift for both OEF and OIF."

Lt. Col. Patrick Mor-dente, 39th AS commander, will be the commander of the deployed unit, which encompasses several units from Dyess, as well as assets from two other C-130 bases.

While their missions will be many and varied, the unit will employ day and night tactical airland and airdrop capability to support the theater commander's requirement for combat delivery operations,

Software helps track fitness progress

The Air Force recently released a tool to help Airmen keep track of their fitness efforts.

The Air Force Fitness Management System is available to all Airmen through the Air Force Portal. The system provides a history of their fitness scores and allows unit fitness managers to enter new scores. It is now the official method to track fitness progress within the Air Force, said Maj. Maureen Harback, the system's program coordinator.

"The purpose of the (system) is to track fitness-assessment results and provide data to commanders," Major Harback said. The system is intended for active-duty, Guard and Reserve Airmen.

The system will keep a history of each Airman's fitness scores. The data is not stored on paper in an Airman's record or even on a computer at an Airman's

In some situations we can't always look out for our teammates, but we have a duty to take care of one another -- you wouldn't let your quarterback get sacked and you shouldn't let your co-worker be unsafe.

Patton Leadership truism -- Kick enemy in the pants

Since the start of this series of articles on leadership and mentoring, we have been graced with outstanding words of wisdom and perspective.

Writing this article was difficult.

What words could be used that were not already?

What could be said that would be new and refreshing?

At a loss, I turned to books on leading and mentoring for inspiration. I found exactly what I was looking for:

"Patton on Leadership; Strategic Lessons for Corporate Warfare" by Alan Axelrod. General Patton's style is refreshing, and I was specifically able to find solace with passages correlating to current challenges facing our military and Team Dyess.

Inscribed by West Point Cadet Patton in his copy of the textbook "Elements of Strategy" were the following qualities of a great general: Tactically aggressive (loves a fight); strength of character; steadiness of purpose; acceptance of responsibility; energy; and good health.

While true our generals need these qualities, I believe they also apply to any successful individual and especial-



ly all members of Team Dyess at this time.

Let me share with you what the author writes about the qualities and then how I believe they apply to our challenge.

If you think of these six items as the requisites of leadership -- and not just military leadership -- they make for a provocative list. Items two through six should provoke no controversy, but putting the love of a fight as number one will not find universal favor. These days, most managers like to talk about compromise and accommodation.

To be sure, such actions are appropriate in some situations, but the fact is that leadership also requires a willingness to be aggressive. In a small minority of situations, an aggressive attitude is necessary in dealing with people.

Most of the time, however, "tactical aggressiveness" is an attitude toward working a problem. It describes a leadership approach that actively engages reality rather than passively waiting for favorable circumstances to shape themselves. In business, "the aggressive leader creates favorable circumstances."

It is quite obvious from the title alone that the author's intent is to take General Patton's successes and relate and integrate them into the business world.

My reason for including his explanation is that it hits home. We must attack current times with an aggressive attitude, as passively waiting for favorable circumstances is a formula for failure -- failure we cannot afford.

All six of these qualities are absolutely essential in each and every member of Team Dyess as we meet the responsibilities our nation has entrusted to us.

Our commitment to winning the global war on terrorism is tied directly to these qualities.

There will be countless reporting in both the newsprint

and visual media of who knew what and when, and more and more debate on whether the terrorist attacks could have been prevented.

We will continue to see reports of American deaths as our military forces deal with fanatics. It is absolutely critical that during this political season we maintain our focus through strength of character and on steadiness of purpose. We accepted this responsibility and this is what separates us from those that have not made this same commitment.

In addition, while shouldering this global war on terrorism responsibility we are preparing for an operational readiness inspection re-look by the Headquarters Air Combat Command Inspector General. Leadership has clearly communicated the laser focus we need to maintain.

In addition, we have been provided with resources as needed, Tiger Teams to pinpoint the laser focus to critical processes and the tactical aggressiveness via practices needed to shape this re-look.

Don't kid yourself in believing this is a paper test or fall on your laurels that we have done this many times before.

This is our opportunity to prove that even though we have deployed numerous times, we are ready to any time our nation calls upon us.

From here each of us has the responsibility to go the extra mile to pick up the problem and use all six of Patton's qualities -- not to meet the challenge but to clearly overwhelm it. By doing so we avoid blundering into the battle.

Instead we attack with a simple General Patton truism, "Hold the enemy by the nose and kick him in the pants!"

Mentorship begins with your involvement

Talk is cheap.

There is no substitute for first-hand experience. In my Air Force career, I can't think of a single instance where a briefing, meeting, e-mail or phone conversation changed my outlook on leadership. All the big impressions came from things that I did or things that I saw.

Fortunately, I had mentors who invested the time in having me watch them lead, dragging me around with them and letting me inside their "walls" so I could understand their actions. For better or for worse, these mentors had a profound impact on the leader and person I am today.

The Airmen you mentor must see you lead.

A true mentor doesn't simply say, "I am your mentor! Hear my wisdom and learn!" It all starts with leadership. More junior Airmen need to identify you as a leader, one they would like to emulate.

Being a visible leader is an absolute prerequisite to mentoring.

You probably do this naturally -- setting goals and priorities for your unit, shop or section, communicating status up and down the chain of command, identifying and correcting weak areas in your team, and all those other good things you learned in Reserve Officer Training Corps, Airman Leadership School and kindergarten.

Whether you do this through commanders' calls, roll



calls, pre-shift briefings, over lunch or even through the much-maligned electronic correspondence, you must be a leader before you can be a mentor.

It can sometimes be hard to make time for more personal interaction and leadership. It can be even harder to make the extra time to drag your mentee with you.

I remember the dread words which always came at the worst possible time, "Lieutenant Weaver, let's go visit the phase docks."

Or, "Lieutenant Weaver, please stand in here for this Article 15 presentation."

Even though it meant sacrificing valuable time to do something that might not have made an immediate difference, the long-lasting impact these events had on me was tremendous.

To observe a leader in a personal setting, watching them lead on small as well as large levels, is something that never fails to make an impact.

To really involve a junior Airman in your mentoring sometimes requires letting them "inside your walls."

Understanding what you are trying to accomplish and how you plan to accomplish it will give a mentee insight into your leadership.

"I really need to get Airman Jones' attention. I guess I'll have to yell and maybe throw this stapler. Please ask him to step in."

This explanation could make the difference between a junior Airmen thinking you are a brilliant supervisor as opposed to thinking you are a raving lunatic. To admire your leadership, mentees must understand your leadership.

Mostly, you just need to go for it.

The worst that could happen is that you could serve as an example of what not to do.

As long as you take the time to drag a mentee with you, even providing a negative example will serve a positive purpose.

So what are you wasting time reading this for? Get off your [deleted], go find a junior Airman and get out there.

Air Force Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel visits Dyess

The Air Force Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel arrived at Dyess Thursday to meet with senior leaders, receive a B-1 orientation flight and attend the World's Largest Barbeque Saturday.

Lt. Gen. Richard "Tex" Brown III has been the deputy chief of staff for personnel since August 2001 and is currently selected for reassignment as the vice commander of Air Education and Training Command.

"I love Dyess, Abilene and the surrounding area," said General Brown. "I grew up less than 100 miles away and it will be great to be back. Although I no longer have

family in the area, it still feels like home."

As deputy of personnel, General Brown serves as the senior Air Force officer responsible for comprehensive plans and policies covering all life cycles of military and civilian personnel management, which includes military and civilian end strength management, education and training and compensation and resource allocation.

"I'm visiting Dyess to get a field perspective of the current operations and to hear from the great Air Force people at Dyess on the current state of the Air Force," the general said. "I'll also be wearing the new test Field Utility Uniform for people to see and get a closer look."

During his time in the Air

Force as a command pilot, the general has flown more than 3,500 hours in A-1, T-37, A-7, F-16 and C-27 aircraft, as well as 140 combat missions in Southeast Asia in the A-1 Skyraider.

He was commissioned in 1970 following his graduation from the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program at Texas Christian University.

During his time in service, the general has earned a variety of awards and decorations such as the Distinguished Service Medal, Silver Star with two oak leaf clusters, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross with one silver and two bronze oak leaf clusters, Meritorious Service Medal

with three oak leaf clusters, Air Medal with two silver and two bronze oak leaf clusters, Air Force Commendation Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with three bronze stars and the Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with Palm.

Prior to assuming his current position, the general was the commander of the Air Force Personnel Center at Randolph Air Force Base, Texas.

"Lastly, I want to return to the Pentagon with a better understanding of the problems and frustrations facing our people," General Brown said. "I also hope to relay to them how much they are appreciated, both from the senior leadership of the Air Force and from the nation."



installation, but rather in an Air Force-wide database. This allows fitness scores to travel with Airmen automatically as they change stations. The universal availability of the data helps ensure Airmen stay current on their fitness assessments, Major Harback said.

"If an Airman transfers

to another base and is not current on their fitness assessment, they will show up as not current in the (system)," the major said.

Many units are still doing monthly practice assessments so Airmen can get themselves into shape for an official assessment. The system does not record practice assessments, but it does include a calculator allowing Airmen to enter in numbers from their practice assessments to see

how they would score, Major Harback said.

"Airmen will have better visibility of their fitness over time, and they can take actions to address their deficiencies or continue working on their strengths," she said.

This fall, commanders will be able to generate reports to track an Airman's progress through education and intervention programs, Major Harback said.

Real-world 'Raptor'

Air Force F/A-22 mission important to all Airmen

LANGLEY AIR FORCE BASE, Va. -- To Air Force people who do not fly or maintain aircraft, the oft-repeated characteristics of the F/A-22 Raptor, "stealth, supercruise, agility, integrated avionics and supportability" probably mean about as much as "independent front suspension" and "aluminum alloy heads" mean to someone who is not really into cars. Not much.

"So what," they might argue, "I'm just a (fill in duty title of choice). The F/A-22 isn't going to affect me or how I do my job."

But they would be wrong -- dead wrong -- and what the "meanest, baddest bird on the planet," as it is described, contributes to America's warfighters, can be summed up in one word.


Survivability. It is a commodity other "legacy" fighters -- the F-15 Eagle and F-16 Fighting Falcon -- will be less likely to provide in future conflict, according to senior leaders.

"I get a lot of comments on the F/A-22," said Gen. John P. Jumper, Air Force chief of staff. "Mostly they say, 'You know general, you guys are so good. The Iraqi air force threw its arms up and quit the first day of the war. They didn't even fly a single sortie. You had four guided surface-to-air missiles fired during the entire war so you've got what you need. What's the problem?'"

In response to that kind of questioning, General Jumper often refers to two axioms: first, that you should not fight the last war; and that people who do not remember history are doomed to repeat it.

"Too many are content to rely, potentially for too long, on yesterday's technology in the majority of the aircraft we use to fight our nation's battles," said Dr. James G. Roche, secretary of the Air Force.

The Air Force has enjoyed some widely publicized successes in the Balkans, Middle East and Afghanistan during the last decade and a half. However, people like Steve Dunn, a former weapons system officer who now serves as an air threat

analyst for Air Combat Command, say that swift, one-sided victories against enemies who have not upgraded their arsenals for the last 15 years are not certainties in future conflicts.

"We've spent the last decade fighting an enemy in the Middle East (who) has tended to anchor our thoughts about what we need in the future," Mr. Dunn said. "If we use that as a lesson for the future, we're making a big mistake."

That potential mistake is poised to manifest itself in the form of next-generation fighter aircraft and integrated air defense systems that are already or will soon be, available to governments willing to pay the price, he said.

"You might have a starving population," Mr. Dunn said, "But you can pick up some advanced fighters."

Those "advanced fighters" include the latest Russian Sukhoi-series fighters and a handful of European-built aircraft that are all rolling off of the showroom floor with features that put them on par with, or ahead of, some Air Force aircraft.

"From time to time, we get our hands on these airplanes (the Russian Sukhoi-series) and we put our very best pilots in them up against our very best pilots from the Navy, the Marine Corps and the Air Force flying our own F-15s, F-14s, F-18s, and F-16s," General Jumper said. "The fact is that our guys flying their airplanes beat our

guys flying our airplanes every single time."

Mr. Dunn said that systems already on the market have the ability to engage as many as six different targets -- old systems could only engage one. He also said that maximum engagement ranges have increased from 25 nautical miles in legacy systems to 100 nautical miles in modern systems.

In a future threat environment, Mr. Dunn said state-of-the-art aircraft linked with equally advanced radar systems and surface-to-air missiles will present a fully integrated, overlapping, and redundant air defense. This will be a more than formidable challenge for America's legacy aircraft.

Secretary Roche and General Jumper, people who know the fickle nature of economics and politics make advanced technology ripe for proliferation, knowing where those challenges will materialize is not nearly as important as being prepared to face and defeat them.

Between the two seemingly opposed axioms there is a "tightrope" between "jumping to tactical conclusions too quickly" and taking the time-

gest that superiority in equipment and superiority in tactics must be viewed as two elusive goals to be constantly pursued," he wrote. "We are not apt to have marked superiority in both equipment and tactics for an extended period; neither side is likely to corner the market on ingenuity for long."

Ironically, General Momyer recorded those words three years after the F-15 entered active service and almost 30 years later it is still America's frontline fighter.

"Not since Orville and Wilbur flew in December of 1903 have we operated an Air Force this old," said Gen. T. Michael Moseley, Air Force vice chief of staff.

In the aftermath of operations Desert Storm, Allied Force and Iraqi Freedom, Air Force leaders no longer talk about air superiority; instead, they often refer to "air dominance."

The change is more than just semantics; it is an evolution of doctrine.


"It's different from the old concept of air superiority where we kept the (sky) clear of things that might drop bombs on our Soldiers, Airmen and Marines on the ground," General Jumper said. "It's this notion of dominance that allows us first to get into the place we're trying to go to -- to kick down the door or be part of kicking down the door -- and allows us to operate at the times and places of our choosing."

Air dominance is sending less people in harm's way and making sure those who go are safer than ever before, Secretary Roche said.

"It's not just the parents of Airmen who are going to be glad we have the F/A-22," said Gen. Hal Hornburg, ACC commander. "It's going to be the parents and the husbands and the wives of Soldiers, Sailors and Marines. Because of the capabilities it brings to the fight, the F/A-22 will result in direct tangible benefits and less loss of blood on the battlefield."

F/A-22 fast facts:

- Stealth**
 - Successfully reflects a radar signature approximately the size of a bumblebee, thereby avoiding detection by the most sophisticated enemy air defense systems
 - Virtually eliminates emissions of sound, turbulence, and heat that can aid detection
 - Requires no direct assistance from electronic support aircraft that may be more easily detected
 - Includes plan form alignment of the wing and tail edges, radar-absorbing sawtoothed surfaces, an engine face that is concealed by a serpentine inlet duct, "stealthy" coating cockpit design to minimize the usually substantial radar return of pilot's helmet
 - Eliminates multiple surface features that could be detected by enemy radar, through internal weapons placement
- Supercruise Speed**
 - F/A-22 testing marks the first time in history a fighter has flown Supercruise, sustaining speeds of Mach 1.5 or greater without using afterburner, achieved at a low power setting, and at less than 275 flight hours in the testing process
 - Velocity is supported by battle efficient, state-of-the-art 35,000-pound thrust class Pratt & Whitney F119-PW-100 engines
 - Speed enables a smaller number of aircraft to control a far greater area, and enter and exit hostile areas in quick fashion, reducing the time a pilot spends over enemy territory, and reducing the risk to American lives
 - Internal weapons have eliminated aerodynamic drag
- Maneuverability**
 - Engine nozzles with thrust vectoring control system
 - Capable of maximum control at speeds slower than opponent's aircraft
 - Supports pilot in dictating terms of engagement, essential to domination of air combat
- Integrated Avionics System**
 - Integrates information from on-board sensors, off-board surveillance systems, intelligence databases, and other military aircraft
 - Supports a complete and coherent view of battlefield -- command and control allows pilot to manage air battle rather than relying on multiple sensory inputs
 - Secures the F/A-22-to-F/A-22 data link (receives data from other aircraft, such as the E-3)
 - Permits communication with a fighter's wingmen without dependence on radio
 - Has completed over 15,000 hours of avionics software testing in the avionics integration lab and over 400 hours of testing on the Boeing 757 F/A-22 Flying Test Bed, thereby identifying discrepancies earlier in the process

With the confidence of Phil Mickelson in the final round of the Masters, golfer Dan Wiggers took to Dyess' Mesquite Grove Golf Course Saturday with victory "in the bag."
