Dyess 'excellent' in ORI

Dyess earned an overall "Excellent" rating during the Air Combat Command Inspector General's two-day Operational Readiness Inspection that

concluded Saturday.

The inspection gave the ACC IG team the opportunity to evaluate the Dyess' ability to generate aircraft and test its mobility process.

"According to the IG, we were very impressive, and they said our team had the best attitude and

enthusiasm they'd ever seen," said Col. Jonathan George, 7th Bomb Wing commander. "The very few mistakes we made were minor and didn't get in the way of proving our combat capability is as good as any military in the world. The 7th excelled."

As part of the inspection, Dyess

was tasked to deploy 454 people and 179 short-tons of cargo to support Pacific Theater operations. During the inspection, the ACC IG team evaluated 10 individual areas. The Dyess team scored an excellent rating in nine of these areas with one satisfactory rating.

According to Col. James Long, ACC ORI team chief, Dyess showed a "tremendous amount of pride" throughout the inspection. The colonel also said the "total focus of the Dyess team" did not go unnoticed by the inspectors.

Airpark gains C-130

A 317th Airlift Group C-130 will move to the front gate today and Saturday to be added to the Dyess Linear Airpark.

The aircraft's journey will begin at 8 a.m. today. The eight-hour transport will end at the wooded area next to the 7th Medical Group. The aircraft's move will conclude Saturday at the front gate opposite the B-1. The 7 a.m. Saturday move is expected to have minimal impact on traffic.

The C-130 is being officially dedicated in an Aug. 23 ceremony. The dedication ceremony marks the 50th anniversary of the first flight of a C-130.

"This is a great way to represent visually what the C-130 fleet works so hard for," said Staff Sgt. Chris Ellis, 317th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron C-130 crew chief instructor and the C-130 static coordinator.

Members of the 317th AG will use a forklift to pull the aircraft along a tow route that has been cleared through a wooded area on the west side of the base.

Once the aircraft is in place, C-130 aircrews will prepare for the August induction.

"The C-130 will be a great addition to our airpark because it shows our current mission flown at Dyess and represents our airlifting capabilities as well as our bombing," said "Doc" Warner, Dyess Linear Airpark and Memorial director.

Base celebrates Juneteenth

The Dyess Black Heritage Committee will host a Juneteenth Festival from 1-6 p.m. Saturday at the base picnic area behind the 7th Medical Group.

"It is a celebration of the true end of slavery," said Senior Master Sgt. Robert Scarlett, event coordinator.

Historically, President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation officially freed all African-Americans from slavery Jan. 1, 1863.

However, some states and sections of the United States still recognized slavery despite the presidential proclamation. Juneteenth honors June 19, 1865, when

a regiment of Union soldiers under Army Maj. Gen. Gordon Granger marched into Galveston, Texas, finally bringing an end to slavery in the U.S.

According to one Web site, Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration of the end of slavery.

"If you want to categorize it, it is a celebration of freedom," Sergeant Scarlett said.

As part of its Juneteenth celebration, the committee will have free food while it lasts, entertainment, as well as educational activities. The event is open to all people.

There will be musical performances from the Abilene Youth Mass Choir, teen gospel group "Pre-destined," as well as individual performances from Ernesta

Singleton and Angela Matthews. A dance group from the Galilee Church will perform and a disc jockey will be on-hand playing a variety of Rhythm and Blues from the 70s and 80s. The festival will also feature an air castle, face painting, balloon animals and story readings.

The free food will feature barbecued chicken, rib tips, hamburgers and hotdogs.

"There will be free food, great music and free community spirit -- that's the real key," Sergeant Scarlett said. "This festival is a true celebration of the freedom that we as Americans have shared for so long."

This is the first year the Dyess Black Heritage Committee has celebrated Juneteenth on base.

Leaders are built through training, experience

Leaders are built, not born.

Have you ever heard people refer to someone as a "natural-born leader?" I think it's safe to say that there's never been a child born that would even remotely qualify as a leader.

Leaders are built through training and experience.

Every child born into this world is helpless, depending on others for their care and survival. Just the same, when we joined the Air Force we needed to learn how to function in a new way of life. We started with basic training where we were taught the basics of Air Force discipline and standards. Most of us came in with our own set of values and basic leadership skills we learned from a role model while growing up. I don't doubt for a moment that all of us can remember who our military training instructor was, what they looked like and the impression they made on us as our first contact with Air Force leaders. Believe me, they didn't teach us to fold our underwear in six-inch squares, make our beds so tight that we could bounce a quarter off of it and catch it mid air, or clean a latrine to sterile laboratory conditions because we were going into the laundry or housekeeping business. These were simple tasks used to train us to follow instructions, maintain discipline and teach us the importance of attention to detail. Just like a builder must do when building a house or skyscraper, the Air Force was laying a foundation to build on.

No person in their right mind would build their house starting with a bad foundation. What do you suppose would happen when the first bad storm hit? The same is true for our subordinates. To build a solid Airman you need a solid foundation. Promotion rates have been at an all-time high over the last few years which means our younger Airmen are moving up in rank and responsibility faster than they did in the past. One of the concerns I've heard from time-to-time is that "the younger troops are getting promoted too fast to get the training and experience they need to be effective supervisors." My answer to that claim is that it's the supervisors who failed the subordinate to a large degree. How could you put all the blame on the subordinate when it is every supervisor's charge to provide training and mentoring for their troops? What if the supervisor put more effort into building up his or her new troop and prepared them for fast progression? The young troop would have a better sense of direction and confidence built in to make smarter decisions and perform their job commensurate with their new rank. The bottom line is the supervisor has to keep pace with



the rapid promotion rates to ready their troop for the next step up. Just because the Airman is promoted doesn't relieve the supervisor from continuing the mentoring process. The training and mentoring goes to the next level.

Feedback is an important step in building a solid leadership foundation. The performance feedback system is a great start when bringing up a new troop but it also benefits the veteran as well. We all know it's mandatory, but what do you discuss with your new troop on their initial? One of the key things I've always stressed with my newest troops besides job knowledge and standards were goals like early completion of career development courses, pursuit of their college degree and promotion expectations to include promotion to senior airman below the zone. I continue this for their mid-term and beyond. The ability to refer to the previous feedback for the mid-term serves well to check progress and chart future direction. I've actually heard the excuse of not performing a performance feedback worksheet because the troop is already awesome. This is not acceptable.

What signal does that send to the ratee? You've passed up the opportunity to provide the positive (and sometimes negative) feedback they deserve. That's definitely not building a good foundation on how to do an effective feedback to subordinates. Besides that, if they are already a "firewall five" in your eyes, are you sure there couldn't be some other goals you could set for them -- even reading one of the books on the CSAF Professional Reading Program list? The feedback tells the subordinate where they stand and gives them direction for further growth. Don't cheat them the opportunity to better themselves.

Informal feedback and recognition are also great tools. Everyone likes to feel good about themselves and likes to be recognized for a job well done. When you let someone know they've done a great job on something in front of their peer group it does two things.

First, it lets the person know you appreciate their contribution.

Second, most of the people in the peer group also want to get that kind of recognition so they strive to match the required performance. What could be better than getting more people in your shop, section or squadron to excel, better themselves and contribute more to the mission? I've seen this work firsthand. It creates an environment of excellence; which of course is one of our Air Force Core Values. Mid-line supervisors learn from your example and provide positive feedback to their troops in turn. Formal recognition is important, but spontaneous recognition works great as well.

What about "negative" feedback? For a lot of people this is a hard thing to do. It's human nature to avoid the uncomfortable. This leads to a flaw in the subordinate's foundation. It doesn't give a fair assessment for the subordinate to learn from and provide clear direction for growth. This problem is compounded when you allow your mid-level supervisors to get away with this as well. I've seen more than my fair share of enlisted performance reports. In my 130-person section, mid-level supervisors would ask me for guidance on ratings or I'd question them

from time-to-time to make sure the ratee was getting a fair and accurate rating. When asked for my input I'd often ask the supervisor to refer to the feedback they'd done with the individual as a check of their conscience. Was the ratee counseled about the area they are considering marking down? Don't make the mistake of using the EPR as a counseling medium. It has always been my rule that no one should be surprised when they see their final EPR. If a ratee is being marked down in an area where they were never counseled during the performance feedback session, there's been a breakdown in the system and a lost opportunity for effective leadership. Teaching this mindset had a positive impact on my mid-line supervisors as they improved the content of their feedbacks and the ratings of their subordinates.

Another great way to build the leadership foundation is to lead by example. The quickest way to failure in this area is by not walking the walk and having a "do as I say, not as I do" attitude. How many times have you been frustrated with supervisors who had an attitude of entitlement and did not lead from the front? Did you correct them on this? I believe that a supervisor shouldn't be allowed to move up until they've replaced themselves.

This means the supervisor has trained one or more of their key subordinates to do the supervisor's job in their absence. This way the troops left behind and the mission do not suffer in the supervisor's absence. This is an excellent way to groom your troops for advancement. Good leaders always follow up to ensure that their troops have everything they need. They do spot checks to ensure that work and safety standards are being adhered to. Get out from behind your desk or out from your truck and talk to your people. See what they're doing and let them know you're interested in them. Again this trains them to do the same as they come up in the ranks.

My final thought on building leaders is the importance of challenging your subordinates.

What I mean is, you need to give your troops challenges that stimulate growth in their leadership potential. Take them out of their comfort zone by assigning tasks that challenge them through the increased effort it takes to succeed. Always be available for guidance if needed, but let them feel they ultimately have the responsibility and you are counting on them to get the job done. Do not confuse empowerment with abandonment. You need to provide inputs when necessary but don't be too quick with providing the answers. When asked a question you can rephrase it for them or ask them additional questions to help lead them to figure it out on their own. This ultimately helps them learn the thought process for problem solving and builds a sound foundation for their future leadership roles.

I realize I've barely scratched the surface on how to build a leader as there are so many different styles of leadership and ways to teach it. My intent was to highlight four tools to build the foundation of your subordinate's leadership potential.

1. Prepare your troops for increased leadership responsibility 2. Provide feedback 3. Lead by example and 4. Challenge your people.

214 Dyess Airmen to sew on new rank

More than 210 Dyess Airmen arrived at work Thursday to the news that they had been selected for promotion.

Of the 214, 94 technical sergeants received word that they will sew on the rank of master sergeant in the next 12 months, and 120 staff sergeants were notified that they will sew on the rank of technical sergeant.

The Air Force promoted more than 25 percent of the 23,956 eligibles to master sergeant in the 2004 promotion cycle.

More than 21 percent of the 42,248 eligible staff sergeants were promoted.

Dyess had 695 eligible staff sergeants, and 373 eligible technical sergeants, making the base promotion percentage more than 20 percent to master sergeant, and more than 17 percent to technical sergeant.







Cadets should not be saluted by enlisted members, but will return a salute rendered by an airman or NCO as a matter of courtesy.


