Dyess civilian lands Air Force award

A Dyess civilian was recently named the Air Force's top communications and information specialist.

Jene Wilton, 7th Communications Squadron deployable communications systems integrator, received the Air Force Outstanding Civilian

Specialist for the year 2003.

"This should really be a team award," said Wilton. "No one person can make communications a successful mission. There were many people involved in the process. I just took their ideas, knowledge and inputs and did the leg work."

"I am proud to be able to accept the award on behalf of all the military and civil servants who

keep the 'Comm machine' running smoothly."

Among his accomplishments, Wilton is credited with being hand-picked to deploy as the sole communications system integrator supporting three operational theaters, completely overhauling telephone switching systems while deployed, preparing and shipping more than 32 tons of communications systems for forward deployment in less than

11 hours, and assisting in the total re-write of the Initial Communications Access Package job-qualification standards.

"I'm thrilled to see Mr. Wilton recognized for this award," said Maj. William Robinson, 7th CS commander. "He's one of a kind -- an outstanding leader and a superior technician. He truly lives the core values, and is well-deserving of this prestigious award."

2003 B-1 records become official

EDWARDS AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. -- Records set by a B-1 Lancer during the 2003 Open House and Air Show were officially certified April 30 by the Fédération

Aéronautique Internationale in Switzerland.

In two flights Oct. 25 and 26, the B-1 set 45 world records and broke five previously set records in the National Aeronautic Association C-1Q and C-1R, Group III weight class.

The 330,000-pound bomber falls

into subclass C-1 for landplanes and Group III for its turbojet engines, said Maj. Wim Libby, 419th Flight Test Squadron assistant director of operations.

It was a long process to get the records certified, Major Libby said.

Dyess Airman lost in swimming mishap Sunday

The Dyess family lost another valuable Airman from the 7th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron Sunday.

Staff Sgt. Alan Sacks, a B-1 defensive avionics technician, disappeared while swimming Sunday at the Elm Creek Reservoir outside of Winters, Texas.

"Any time we lose a teammate it hurts," said Col. Jonathan George, 7th

Bomb Wing commander. "Staff Sgt. Sacks has a great reputation as is evidenced by the huge community of friends and co-workers who have come out to show their love and admiration of Alan."

Sergeant Sacks was born Nov. 6, 1979 in Vancouver, Wash. He graduated from James Madison High School in San Antonio in May 1998. The self-proclaimed, San Antonio-native entered the Air Force Nov. 24, 1998.

Base safety office stresses summer safety

Following a noticeable increase in water-related sports and recreational fatalities, the Dyess safety office is reminding every Airman to stay safe this summer.

"Everybody needs to be safety-conscious no matter what they are doing," said Tech. Sgt. William

Goldsberry, 7th Bomb Wing safety office. "This year the Air Force has already matched last year's water related fatalities and we have not even begun the 101 Critical Days of Summer Safety."

The 101 Critical Days of Summer Safety are the days from Memorial Day to Labor Day. During this time period, the Air Force loses more Airmen in both on- and off-duty fatalities than

any other time of the year. As part of its drive to increase summer water safety, the 7th BW safety office suggests:

- Always wear a life jacket. All boat operators and passengers are required to wear a life jacket. Approximately 85 percent of all drowning victims were not wearing life jackets.
- Avoid alcohol. Approximately, 39 percent of all

boating fatalities were a result of alcohol involvement.

- Enroll in a boat education class. Falling overboard and boat capsizings resulted in more than 50 percent of all reported fatalities last year. The state of Texas also requires a certified boater education course be taken by all operators born after Sept. 1, 1984.

Leadership -- expect a two-way street

As a young lieutenant many years ago, I read a quote attributed to then-recently-retired Army Gen. Colin Powell. While I can't remember the words verbatim, it went something like this: "Parents, spouses, children and the American people have entrusted their sons and daughters to my care."

His words affected me very deeply and made me rethink my role as a leader. As a leader, what do the troops, their loved ones and the American people expect out of me?

Twelve years later, I still don't have an exact answer to the question of what is exactly expected out of me as a leader.

I'm pretty sure I will never have a perfect answer. No one does.

However, through experience, professional military education, reading and mentorship from all ranks, I'd like to think that I've optimistically come up with the primary building blocks or pillars on what I personally believe my troops should expect from me as a leader and at the moment, as a commander.

When I first took command, I laid down my expectations to my troops and immedi-

ately afterwards, I told them that these were some of the expectations they should have from me as a leader and commander:

- Provide strong leadership -- my job is to provide the game plan on where the squadron needs to go. It's my job to make the tough calls and not be wishy-washy on the tough issues. The troops should know their role and purpose in accomplishing the wing's mission and how the squadron fits in. This can only happen via effective communication through the ranks. A leader must constantly communicate to the troops whether it's one-on-one, flight calls, commander's calls, Airmen breakfasts/lunches, etc. Only when all Airmen of a unit are on the same page can it reach peak mission effectiveness.

- Take care of people -- as a leader, I am responsible to ensure that everyone in the squadron, to include their families, are properly looked after. I believe in the old adage that if you take care of the people, they will take care of the mission. Taking care of people ranges from recognition for a job well done, to ensuring that their families are looked after when their loved one is deployed. A wise chief master sergeant many years ago showed me that the most important way to take care of the troops

was to ensure that they get timely, accurate and quality performance reports. An Airman may win all the Air Force awards available, but if it isn't in their performance report, or it's written too late to affect their promotion, then it really doesn't matter what awards they have won. That piece of paper is the most important way to take care of your people -- it affects their lives and careers.

- Provide resources -- let's face it, no matter how good the troops are, they can't get the job done without the right tools and equipment. Leaders have a responsibility to ensure that before the troops are asked to accomplish a job, they have the right tools and equipment. Resources also include timely and good quality training. In today's tight money environment, it's easier said than done. However, a leader must never give up ensuring their troops have the right resources to do the job.

- Treat everyone with dignity and respect -- every person, whether civilian or from airman basic to a general, should be treated with the utmost dignity and respect at all times. If a troop commits a mistake, as a leader, I should just address the mistake, take appropriate action and provide additional mentorship. That's all. I, nor anyone

else, have the right to denigrate them as a person no matter how big the mistake was. Treating everyone with dignity and respect, and ensuring that people are judged only by merit, ensures a professional and well-disciplined military organization.

- What I ask of you, you will get of me -- as a leader, I shouldn't ask the troops to do something that I wouldn't do myself. If I ask that they live by the core values, so should I. If the troops are working 12 hours shifts, I along with squadron leadership will be working 12 hour shifts as well. It's the right thing to do.

There are other expectations that I believe my Airmen should have of me as their leader and commander, but for the purposes of this article, I addressed what I feel are the foundation of what those expectations are. Keep in mind that these are my own personal beliefs developed through my experiences. Different leaders, no matter their rank, have different ideas on what they should be providing to their troops. All leaders are different, just like all squadrons are different. Bottom line, expectations are a two way street -- it is not just leaders that have expectations of their troops -- their troops also have expectations of their leaders as well.

Mentoring -- share experiences, learn from others

In preparation for writing this article, I did a lot of reading about mentoring. I started with the excellent series of articles in the *Peacemaker*, written by our leaders here at Dyess. I also did some research on the Internet and in the Air Force Instructions.

What struck me most from my research was the huge variation in definitions of exactly what mentoring means and the large numbers of programs that implement it. Around the world, mentoring programs are found in communities, schools, universities, businesses, professional organizations, non-profit organizations, health-care organizations and in all levels and all branches of governments.

As a result of my research and in an attempt to boil it down somewhat, I've pulled together a very short, very basic "Mentoring Frequently Asked Questions list" that will give you my version of bare-bones mentoring. By no means is this meant to be comprehensive. In fact, it's not even close -- that would be impossible in a single article.

- What is mentoring?

Although the definitions for "mentoring" are as wide and varying as is the advice on how to do it,

most agree that mentoring involves a more-experienced person taking an active role in helping a less-experienced person grow or learn through sharing knowledge, experiences and insight. Mentoring can be either informal or formal, and can be either scheduled or completely spontaneous and situational.

- What is the difference between formal and informal mentoring?

Informal mentoring happens regularly and often without either the mentor or mentee realizing it. Our parents, grandparents, teachers, leaders, coaches, in fact any role model, practices informal mentoring when they give you advice or share a "there I was..." experience.

Formal mentoring, on the other hand, is more regimented. Typically, a formal mentor is identified by an organization in a career or professional relationship, and conducts regular meetings with the specific aim of increasing the mentee's professional skills and knowledge. Formal mentors usually take this role for a certain amount of time in any particular relationship after which the relationship moves to an informal mentoring stage as the mentee expands their own professional horizons.

- Do I need to decide between

one mentor type or the other?

No. According to AFI 36-3401, the Air Force considers your immediate supervisor to be your formal mentor. However, it also recommends that you seek out formal mentorship from commanders and other experienced individuals either in your chain of command or in your career specialty. Informal mentorship will happen as long as you just keep your eyes and ears open and listen to and learn from those with more experience.

- Do I need a mentor?

Yes. Unless you have experienced all there is to experience the simple answer is "yes." Everyone, military or civilian, who is interested in learning from experience and wishes to avoid the mistakes others have already made, should have a mentor. Although you may not desire a formal mentoring relationship other than between yourself and your supervisor, everyone can benefit from informal mentorship.

- Am I a mentor?

Yes. If you've been through basic training, if you've graduated from any technical training or professional military education, if you have children, or even if you've changed station more than once -- you are already more experienced than at least one other person in your unit and you are an informal

mentor. If you are a supervisor, then per AFI direction you are a formal mentor. It is your responsibility to help your troops grow and learn, not only through official feedback and other supervisory duties, but also by teaching and encouraging them to study our Air Force history and doctrine, by encouraging membership in professional organizations and by offering career counseling and advice.

- What are the benefits of mentoring?

If it isn't already obvious, mentoring offers huge benefits for both the mentor and mentee. For the mentor, you get a chance to put your experiences into words, to save somebody from making the same mistakes you made, or to even learn from your mentee when you have to dig into the books to answer their questions. For the mentee, you get a chance to learn from experience, to get advice that you might not have considered or found on your own and to learn from someone who's "been there and done that." In fact, both sides learn from increased communications and an exchange of ideas.

- Where can I find out more about mentoring?

As I mentioned in the lead paragraph, the resources available are almost endless. Start with AFI

36-3401, Air Force Mentoring, then check out the Internet. The Dyess Web site, <https://wwwmil.dyess.af.mil/>, has links to resources that include online versions of all the articles in this series and links to many other military resources.

Type in "mentor" on the www.af.mil Web site search engine for other articles that have been published. The article by Lt. Col. Penny Bailey titled "Make a difference, become a mentor" is a great place to start. Utilize the official Air Force online mentoring tool -- eVector -- located on the Assignment Management System or check out the "Career" tab in the Air Force Portal at www.my.af.mil.

Finally, when you're ready to expand beyond the basics of mentoring, go to your favorite Internet search engine and type in "mentoring" or "mentor" and stand back. When I did this, it returned more than 90 pages of links from organizations and businesses around the world.

The bottom line -- mentoring is a universal concept in which everybody, formal or informal, mentor and mentee, plays an important part. Share your experiences and learn from others. The resources are out there if you are interested. So what are you waiting for? Get started -- mentor!

Information, assistance for Dyess voters available

All military servicemembers and their families can vote in federal, state and local elections, this year. This year's presidential election will be held Nov. 2.

The absentee voting process consists of four steps:

Step 1. The U.S. citizen must complete and mail a federal application form.

Step 2. A local election official will then approve registration and request further information.

Step 3. The local election official then mails the absentee ballot back to the citizen.

Step 4. The citizen votes and mails the absentee ballot to the local election official in time to meet state deadlines.

Federal application forms can be obtained through several channels. Each squadron has a voting assistance officer to assist with completing the form and other voting concerns.


The federal post card application form serves as a simultaneous application for voter registration and an absentee ballot. Citizens should send in a new FPCA each time they move. Ballots should be requested at least 60 days prior to the election to ensure enough mail transit time.

The issue of voting residence can be complex, said Capt. Frank Fischer, 7th Bomb Wing installation voting officer.

Even in states where laws clearly define criteria for determining voting residence, the final determination is up to each local election official. If a person is uncertain about their current legal voting residence, they should consult legal counsel, he added.

Recalled Air Force officer retires -- again

WASHINGTON -- An Airman who began his military career as a Marine Corps rifleman in 1962 is retiring for the second time.

Lt. Col. Theron Sims, who is on terminal leave, rejoined the Air Force on May 15, 2002, as part of the Rated Officer Recall Program. Colonel Sims was the service's senior lieutenant colonel, with an Oct. 1, 1983, date of rank.

The colonel originally retired from active duty Jan. 1, 1989. He returned to the Air Force following the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.

Colonel Sims said there are a lot of veterans in Vail, Colo., where he is living at the time.

"We asked what we could do to help," he said.

The answer came in the form of an e-mail from the commander of 8th Air Force at Barksdale Air Force Base, La.

"He said he was having a pilot shortage, that he didn't have enough pilots and navigators to man the combined air operations center," Colonel Sims said. "He said if I'd come back and work in the CAOC, he could take a pilot out and put him back in the cockpit."

Shortly after his reactivation, Colonel Sims deployed for exercises in Korea with Barksdale's CAOC.

"One of the things (Air Force Chief of Staff) General John P. Jumper did was put the 8th Air Force CAOC into the air and space expeditionary force," Colonel Sims said. "Instead of working in a staff job, I deployed to Korea (for an exercise) and then to Prince Sultan Air Base, Saudi Arabia, and Al Udeid AB, Qatar."

Colonel Sims spent six months as the CAOC's chief of the time-sensitive targeting branch. One of the operations he "pushed" was the first combat strike using a new automated deep-operations coordination system.

The colonel followed up his Operation Iraqi Freedom duty with a 12-month assignment as executive officer to Brig. Gen. Stephen Goldfein, the director of operational capability requirements at the Pentagon.

Colonel Sims served two tours in Vietnam during his first active Air Force stint, flying 250 combat missions as a forward air controller in 1968, and 65 missions as a B-52 Stratofortress pilot during the 1972 "Linebacker I" campaign.

"I had mixed feelings (about him returning to active duty), but I know he's always been very patriotic," said the colonel's wife, Bonnie. "It was quite different this time because I did get an e-mail from him once in a while, and phone calls, so it was not like it had been years ago."

Colonel Sims is one of 208 former

active-duty officers who returned to duty through the recall program.

"It's been a hoot; it's been a great two years, and I wouldn't trade it for anything," he said. "But now I'm going home, back to Vail."

After the flights, the NAA observers had to complete a detailed report for each record, he said. Once observers completed the report, the records needed to be approved as "national records" by NAA officials. Then all the paperwork had to be sent to the FAI.

"Because we had so many records, it took (FAI officials) a few months to go through all the paperwork again and verify we satisfied all the requirements before they declared the results official world records," he said.

With the start and finish of most record-breaking flights flown above air show activity, the bomber followed three closed-circuit

courses and two speed dashes.

"It was an unbelievable honor to be a part of an event of this magnitude and certainly was the opportunity of a lifetime for most, if not all of us," said Maj. Troy Asher, 419th FLTS director of operations. "For the past 11 years, I have been part of a large group of aviators who have been trying to get the world to stand up and

take note of the awesome capabilities of the B-1.

"Ironically, this record-setting event comes at a time when the B-1 is also proving itself in operations around the world. This event will possibly serve as icing on the cake for the great things the B-1 is doing in support of the war on terrorism and help solidify it as the weapon system of choice for the future," he said.





TORA! TORA! TORA!

Living history visits Dyess Airshow

Among the many aerial acts coming to Dyess' Big Country Appreciation Day airshow is "Tora! Tora! Tora!"

"Tora! Tora! Tora!" is the Commemorative Air Force's recreation of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor that signaled the beginning of the American involvement in World War II. Designed as a living history lesson, "Tora! Tora! Tora!" is intended as a memorial to all the soldiers on both sides who gave their lives for their countries.

"Many people have the opportunity to travel to visit a museum, but rarely does the museum come to visit you," said Dr. Elliot Pood, "Tora! Tora! Tora!" representative. "Attending an airshow where 'Tora! Tora! Tora!' is performing is like having a 3-dimensional museum come to visit you."

"Tora! Tora! Tora!" began in 1972, when six replica Japanese aircraft used in the movie of the same name were donated to the CAF. The Gulf Coast Wing requested assignment of the aircraft and began developing an act for presentation at air shows.

The act debuted at the

Galveston Air Show on June 25, 1972. By 1977, "Tora! Tora! Tora!" had gained national exposure. By 1978, the show began to make international appearances in Canada and Mexico. In 1991 "Tora! Tora! Tora!" participated extensively in the 50th anniversary year commemorations of Pearl Harbor and in 1992, the group tackled the challenge of sending two replica Japanese aircraft to Alaska to participate in the 50th anniversary commemoration of the raid on Dutch Harbor. Throughout the 1990s, "Tora! Tora! Tora!" has been in demand at air shows throughout the country and, as recently as the spring of 2000, the team's aircraft and pilots participated in the filming of a new movie on the Pearl Harbor attack. As of this year, the men and women of "Tora! Tora! Tora!" have been performing as a professional air show act for 32 years.

The motto of the Commemorative Air Force and the "Tora! Tora! Tora!" act is "Lest we forget."

According to CAF representatives, "Tora! Tora! Tora!" like other CAF flying history recreations, is not intended to promote nationalism or glorify war. The intent of the group is to help generations of individuals throughout the world born after World War II understand that war does not discriminate in the pain it causes and that courageous individuals on both sides lose their lives. In furtherance of their mission, the group has participated in the making of numerous documentaries produced by Japanese filmmakers as well as Japanese historians.

"The pilots and crew of 'Tora! Tora! Tora!' are proud of the reputation they have developed with veterans of the Japanese military as an accurate lesson on the history of the time and as a tribute to themselves and their comrades," Dr. Pood said. "Over the years, 'Tora! Tora! Tora!' has brought both American and

Japanese veterans together to celebrate the spirit of cooperation our two nations have enjoyed for more than 50 years. At air shows throughout the country, Japanese veterans living, working and visiting in this country have had an opportunity to meet with the group and join with American veterans in a spirit of brotherhood and friendship that only former servicemen can experience."

During the average year, "Tora! Tora! Tora!" performs in 12 to 16 air shows with eight to 10 vintage aircraft participating in each show. In addition, each performance includes approximately 61 pyrotechnic effects. The average show requires the coordinated effort of a minimum of 20 to 26 individuals both in the air and on the ground.

One air show industry publication noted, "...flying and working with a keen sense of spirit and camaraderie, these men and set themselves apart from other air show acts by exhibiting a professionalism that over the years has earned them the distinction as one of the best acts in the industry."

"This level of achievement is truly extraordinary when one considers that 'Tora! Tora! Tora!' is comprised entirely of volunteers," Dr. Pood said. "Every single person associated with this group

has volunteered his or her time, skills and financial resources to accomplish one simple feat -- the telling of a true story, a piece of history. In this respect, it is more than just another air show act. It is a team of volunteers dedicated to an air show act that can best be described as a living history museum."


As the pilots taxi for takeoff, ground crew and bomb squad members can frequently be seen saluting the pilots.

"From that moment in the air show until the final notes of Kate Smith's rendition of 'God Bless America' are heard as the smoke and fires finally fade away, the men and women of 'Tora! Tora! Tora!' are dedicated to one simple, yet powerful task -- the telling of the story, 'lest we forget,'" Dr. Pood

said. "Dedication, selflessness, commitment -- these terms are synonymous with the men and women of 'Tora! Tora! Tora!'"

Several others share Dr. Pood's excitement of the living history performance.

According to one air show promoter, "An airshow without 'Tora! Tora! Tora!' or their bomb squad is just another fly by. Treat yourself to a day at the museum, a multi-sensory, 3-D living history museum known as 'Tora! Tora! Tora!'"


