SUBJECT: DoD Stop Movement Policy Guidance for Dyess AFB Personnel and Families

1. Dyess Air Force Base leadership is committed to protecting the health of our Airmen and to preserving the ability to conduct operations for the defense of our nation. As a result of the continuing spread of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19), the Department of Defense (DoD) has restricted domestic travel as outlined in the 13 March 2020 memorandum titled "Stop Movement for all Domestic Travel for DoD Components in Response to COVID-19". This memorandum implements DoD Guidance for Dyess AFB personnel.

2. Effective 20 March 2020 the following policies apply to military personnel assigned to Dyess AFB:

a. Local area is defined in AFI 36-3003 as the place where the member lives and from which he or she commutes to their duty station. All military leave outside the local area is cancelled. Exceptions must be approved by the first General Officer or Senior Executive Service leader in the member's chain of command. All military currently on leave outside the local area must begin the immediate orderly return to Dyess AFB.

b. All military will remain within 75 miles from Dyess AFB at all times. Exceptions can be approved in writing by the first commander in the member's chain of command for good cause.

c. All military members will restrict their travel and exposure to the maximum extent possible and avoid non-duty locations where 10 or more people can congregate.

d. All military members are prohibited from patronizing bars, restaurants, breweries or any other public dining or drinking establishment. EXCEPTION: Where pick-up, drive-through, or take-out options are available. Military members may enter the establishment to purchase food for consumption at home or their place of duty.

3. Dyess AFB civilians and families are strongly encouraged to adhere to similar practices. It is the responsibility of all Commanders and supervisors at all levels to ensure compliance with this instruction. Failure to comply with the mandatory provisions in this memorandum by Regular Air Force military members, Air Force Reserve military members on active duty, and Air National Guard military members in Title 10 status is a violation of Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

5. This policy supersedes any previous policies of the same subject and remains in effect until it is updated or rescinded. Individuals impacted by these policies should work any questions or issues through their supervisor and Squadron Commanders. We appreciate all that you do to ensure the health, safety, and security of our families and community and for the defense of our great nation. Looking forward, I fully intend to lift these restriction as quickly as local conditions allow.
