## MEMORANDUM FOR ALL DYESS AIR FORCE BASE

SUBJECT: Revision of Dyess AFB COVID-19 Travel and Health Protection Order

1. In response to the rapid spread of 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) <u>delta variant</u> in the local area, Dyess Air Force Base is increasing Health Protection Condition (HPCON) to BRAVO and publishing a revised COVID-19 Travel and Health Protection Order.

2. Our strategy to mitigate the Delta variant is straightforward: masks, physical distancing, and vaccine. Mask wear continues to be required for all individuals when indoors and is full-explained within the attached order. Physical distancing of 6 feet is necessary to avoid close contacts. Especially when indoors, take the measures to maintain physical distancing. Vaccines remain available and are highly encouraged, and if you have taken or do take the vaccine you are granted a 1-day pass to take in conjunction with the Federal Holiday - Columbus Day in October 2021. Finally, commanders remain authorized to approve teleworking when the mission allows and we encourage doing so for medically high-risk individuals, as defined by the CDC.

3. The intent of this order is to protect our people and our mission.

4. Failure to comply with the provisions in this memorandum and the COVID-19 Travel and Health Protection Order by Regular Air Force military members, Air Force Reserve military members on active duty, and Air National Guard military members in Title 10 status is a violation of Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. Those not in Title 10 status who violate the order risk revocation of access within the installation.

5. Please address questions to your leadership and command teams. Thanks for your adjustment, comply with the mitigation, stay-connected, and get the shot. Together, we will continue to rock our shared mission -- Team Dyess...Lift and Strike!
