Colonel Michael J. Fellona is the Vice Commander, 317th Airlift Wing, Dyess Air Force Base, Texas. He assists the Commander in ensuring the readiness of over 1,100 active-duty military and civilian personnel, along with 28 C-130J aircraft engaged in worldwide combat aerial delivery operations.

Colonel Fellona, a native of Arnold, Maryland, and was commissioned in 1996 with a degree in Environmental Engineering from the U.S. Air Force Academy. He has held operational flying assignments at Ramstein AB, Germany, Pope AFB, North Carolina and Little Rock AFB, Arkansas. Colonel Fellona is a Distinguished Graduate of the U.S. Air Force Weapons School and was also a member of the selectively manned 29th Weapons School Instructor Cadre. He is a certified U.S. Air Force Foreign Area Officer (FAO) and has served in various international assignments including the NATO Force Command Headquarters in Madrid, Spain and U.S. European Command Headquarters in Stuttgart, Germany. Col Fellona attended the NATO Defense College in Rome, Italy where he earned a postgraduate certificate (with merit) in Post-Cold War World Order from Leicester University, United Kingdom.



Colonel Fellona is a command pilot with over 3,100 hours in multiple variants of the C-130 aircraft, flying in support of Operations JOINT FORGE/GUARDIAN, ALLIED FORCE, ENDURING FREEDOM and IRAQI FREEDOM.
